When that death is by suicide, many among us privately acknowledge that the member died because of the line of duty yet, until now, there was no formal way for the policing family to memorialize these tragedies.

Canada Beyond the Blue is committed to ensuring these individuals are never forgotten and that their names are spoken aloud and recorded in order to honour their service.

Canada Beyond the Blue, with the support of the OACP, PAO, OPP, OPPA, TPS and TPA is proud to plan a formal ceremony and lasting memorial to commemorate police members who have died because of the line of duty.

The relentless exposure to on-the-job trauma can significantly impact the mental health of police members. Establishing a distinct memorial not only dignifies their service but also prompts stakeholders to advocate for comprehensive policies addressing the mental well-being of police members and their families.
